On June 4, 1968, Senator Robert F. Kennedy won the California Democratic presidential primary, making him a favorite to become the next president of the United States. In the early morning hours following his victory he was fatally shot, just two months after Martin Luther King Jr. had been slain. Both of their deaths devastated the country's hopes for a more enlightened future.
